# WHAT ARE PRONOUNS?

Pronouns are words (or phrases) you substitute for nouns (a name) when the listener already knows who you are referring to.

For example: Yadid is a beautiful singer. They sang at our event last night.




#### IMPORTANT

Not everyone uses the same pronouns. Some use one set of pronouns, multiple or none. Here are some ways that you can find out what someone's pronouns are.



Include your pronouns in your work email signature, even if you are cisgender!

This is a simple way to make people feel comfortable using their pronouns.



You can add them to your nametags and business cards too!



Hi my name is Aaron, my pronouns are He/Him

Try introducing yourself with your pronouns. This will help put others at ease to tell you theirs.



Hello, I'm Sam, my pronouns are They/Them

When in doubt use 'They.'
This avoids assuming someone's gender. Once they tell you, switch to the pronouns they use!


